

Stream A: Financial Life Skills for Boarders

Video	Description	E-Poster
<p>Boarders know how to spend, not save</p> 	<p>This activity gives you an opportunity to debate the topic: Boarders learn how to spend when boarding, not how to save.</p>	
<p>Investment and Investing</p> 	<p>This video introduces students to some basic concepts related to investment and investing. It is based on an interview with Mary Kelly a young financial planner from the Financial Planning Association of Australia. The video helps to explain to students why teens should learn some basic investment concepts and how they could get involved with their parent's support.</p>	
<p>Your habits with money will make a difference</p> 	<p>The purpose of this video is to make you think about the importance of habits, especially those that relate to your use of money. It is very important while you are young to develop good habits that relate to money.</p>	
<p>Invest in yourself</p> 	<p>This video slideshow introduces students to the concept of investing in yourself, that is investing in your own development. It moves from examples of people investing in their health, their life</p>

Gambling: Gaming Machines



This video introduces students to the myths and facts related to gaming machines (pokies). It is based on a film produced by the NSW Government to help inform people about the realities of gambling, and to mitigate potential problem gambling situations. The video helps to explain to students the principal or chance or probability that underpins this form of entertainment.


